Regular Meeting Minutes

January 8, 2011 Meeting

Meeting was called to order President Ron Day. There were 34 members present.

Guest Douglas Halvorson from Bismarck was introduced.

President Day asked for approval of the minutes of the December meeting. Motion was made by Bryce Hill and seconded by Alan Erickson. Motion was passed by voice vote.

Treasurer's Report: Larry Zubke presented the Treasurer's report noting all bills are paid.

Newly elected E-Board officers were introduced: Dolly Erickson as Secretary, Larry Zubke as Treasurer. Jim Helbling was absent. Next meeting January 11, 2010.

President Day gave a reminder of the Holiday Party to be held that evening at the Eagle's. Bring a gift for the gift exchange if you want to take part. Also noted was to bring the article that you would want to submit for the AAW 25th Anniversary Project.

Show and Tell:

Duey Marthaller brought 2 screwdrivers with handles made of hickory and olive. He also showed a large maple burl bowl.

Rick Drown brought slim line bullet pens he had made.

Sam Fears brought a beautiful large hollow form he had created from black ash.

Ralph Feland brought a gavel made of red blood and also laminated material. He also brought jewelry made from red and orange maple purchased from Craft Supplies.

Alan Erickson gave tips on drilling on the lathe that he had learned from experience.

Spud brought the steady rest he had built.

Bryce Hill brought an ice cream scoop with a handle made of hickory and mini forks.

Bob Folske brought a bowl made from burr oak and a jewelry box made from poplar. When the top was taken off, the ring on the bottom could be worn as a bracelet.

Earl Setterlund brought several bottle stoppers of several different designs.

Kris Roberts brought a display of a many ornaments. These had all been hand painted by Alice Berning.

Pat Schweitzer brought the wine bottle he had made which was filled with wine bottle stoppers. This to represent the project we would commit to for the AAW symposium.

Pat Schweitzer presented the demonstration of turning bottle stoppers. Very well done with lots of good hints for all on finishes that could be applied.

Dolly Erickson, Secretary February Demonstration – Combination Screwdriver

The first topic will be a discussion on selecting, processing, and drying small logs. Alan Lacer wrote an article on this project in "American Woodturner" and marketed a kit to build them. The cost of the kit was about \$10 without the wood but did include a nice brass cap and ferrule for the ends. Discount kits are now available.

This demonstration will use an inexpensive purchased combination screwdriver that is disassembled. A local wood will be used and the brass ferrule will be from a purchased piece of brass pipe. Kits, including wood, will be available for purchase at cost.

SNOW BIRD NEWS

January 2011

Hi y'all!! Greetings from cool Texas.

On January 8th I attended a meeting of the Brazos Valley Wood Turners in Waco, Texas. The meeting was held at the Texas State Technical Center, a nice facility. I was invited to the meeting by James Norton past president. The club was organized in October 2004 and has around 40 plus members which includes several women. The newly elected president is Tom Dean. The chatter prior to the meeting was much like at our meetings.

The featured turner that day was Bill Meador who demonstrated turning several candle holders, reminding us that Christmas was only 350 days away. He used guitar strings to burn in lines and dye to embellish the turnings. He stated that we should use tea lights rather than votive candles as they burn hotter than tea lights. Most of his tools were without handles, which cuts down on the bulk that we haul around. He demonstrated the use of the Easy Wood roughing gouge that has a special carbide cutter on the end. It worked great. I'll practice over the summer and demonstrate a couple of the candle holders at a future meeting.



When duplicating spindles, one little slip and poof your detail bead is now a nice big cove and you have to decide if to start over or do a design change on all of the spindles. Taking the time to practice fine detailed cuts on a spindle or any object will pay big dividends in your skills development. CAVEAT

When gluing wood to wood or wood to metal, do so while the wood is raw. Finished wood glued to any surface will eventually break loose. To prevent glue from bleeding on raw wood, before applying the glue brush on sealer adjacent to the area to be glued. Once the glue dries thoroughly, lightly sand the sealed area and then proceed to finish the project as planned.





Symposium Dos & Don'ts

The Dakota Woodturners 2011 Hands-on Symposiums is in just a couple weeks. Now is the time to make sure you are ready to get the most out of the symposium. The following information may help you in that preparation and provide you with a few ideas to make this symposium a great success for you and your fellow turners.

First and the most important item is Safety. Don't forget to bring you eye protection e.g. safety glasses, face shield, or goggles. Another safety item is a dust mask, while heavy sanding is not recommended during the symposium, there will be some sanding and obviously the generation of wood dust during the turning process will occur. Also don't forget about the dust mask during the sharpening process, the grinding of tools generates grinding stone dust, which is particularly hazardous to the lungs. One last thing on dust, please don't bring exotic woods to turn. Some folks have allergies to exotic wood and the last thing we want is for someone to have a problem from the dust.

An often forgotten safety aspect to woodturning is having sharp tools. A sharp tool is much safer then one that is dull, which requires more force and effort to use. Be sure your tools are sharp and ready to go. Club members are available to assist with sharpening. Avoid having the demonstrator take time sharpening your tools taking away time they can spend helping others on the pro-

jects.

One other Safety Tip is to ensure the safe carrying and storage of tools. Don't carry or store your tools in a bucket or other container with the tips of the tools sticking up in the air, one slip and fall and you may become a pin cushion. Also, when walking around the demonstration room with a tool in your hands, be aware of where the sharp tip is. There will be a lot of folks moving from their lathe to the grinder and back and an inadvertent turn or bump could result in a bad situation.

As we have done in the past few symposiums, we will move the demonstrators from room to room and not the participants. This will allow each of you that bring in your own lathe to stay with your lathe and equipment. When you arrive at the symposium, please enter through the Southwest doors at the Bismarck School Career Academy, we will have signs posted. Alan Erickson with the help of Ken Ness and Ron Day will direct you to your respective room.

Recommended items to bring to the symposium:

Safety Items (Safety Glasses a must) - Sharpened Turning Tools (Spindle Gouges, Bowl Gouges, etc.)

Lathe (tool rest, live center, drive center and chuck) - Worm screw for chuck (drill bit sized for your worm screw) - Lathe Stand (optional light)

Ext. Cord and Power Strip

Other Normal Turning supplies

(CA glue, accelerator, ruler, calipers, etc)

If you don't have the items on the above list, not to worry we will have extras and we are a sharing group. In addition to the above items, we will need you to bring the following items (if you have them):

Wood burner and Wood burning Pens—X-acto knives—Inexpensive small artist brushes or small glue brushes—Bowl blank sized to your lathe—Turned item to decorate if you have one (bowl, platter, vase, etc.)

Be sure that all of you equipment/tools are labeled, as we all have ordered our turning equipment from the same location and they all look alike. The labeling will also help to identify the rightful owner of an item which may be left behind.

It is always appropriate to be courteous to the other attendees and demonstrators (not hard for this bunch). Please avoid interjecting too much, each person has their way of doing a project and folks are attending the symposium to see and hear how the demonstrator does the project, not necessarily how you would However, do ask quesdo it. tions. The best way to learn is if you're engaged in the program. Also, you paid good money to attend, so get your questions answered.

One last item, if you have any questions on what to bring or need for the symposium, please give Ron Day a call at (701) 223-6756 or any E-board member.



Dennis Schwind showed a bottle stopper made from Badlands cedar, walnut and soap stone.

Cliff Rime showed a bowling pin clock and explained how to cut the pin "with" the grain so as to be able to mount the clock inside. He also showed a birdhouse.

Gary Nagel brought a cedar bottle stopper he had made with a captive ring.

Ron Torgeson showed a bottle stopper he had made with black walnut and had used a hat pin with the Prairie Rose insignia on it. Also showed his "holy" bowl and how he "made it work" with putting in a handle. Also showed how he had attached rubber to a piece of wood to use in turning.

Alan Erickson showed a tool that he had created using router bits. The design on the handle was made using the new spiral tooth tool he had purchased.

Kris Roberts brought a bottle stopper made from flowering crab tree wood. He also brought a bottle stopper made from ebony and jatoba. He also showed a beautiful candle stick made using "insideoutside turning".

She will paint info on the stoppers before the display is taken to St. Paul for the AAW Symposium.

Ron Day presented to vases that he had made. One from box elder with turquoise added for accent and the other from a burl.

Louie Schroeder showed a bowl and also a spin top item made from apple wood.

Greg Pollert showed a bowl turned from cottonwood finished with tung oil.

Dale Hurt showed what used to be a cheese platter and now was a cookie tray made from walnut. Finish was done with wipe on poly.

Ernie Oster showed several segmented bowls using walnut, maple, mesquite, walnut veneer, cherry, spalted maple and ebony. He used sealer and urethane on most.

Louis Pittman brought a maple bowl that he had worked on and then let set over night. It had developed a large crack and so became a new creative piece. Also he shoed a set of three bowls made from spalted curly maple.

Gary Nagel showed a platter in which he had put in a Celtic knot. Also he brought a piece of elm that he had made a unique platter shape of and had burned in a cross.

Items to be displayed at the Bismarck Library need to be brought to the August meeting.



time to have someone take it over who has some new and fresh ideas. I would like to see someone step forward soon and I will assist the new editor in the transition over the next couple of months.



Newsletter

I was asked to provide a short synopsis of what is involved in producing the newsletter so potential volunteers would know what is required.

The duties of the Newsletter Editor include compiling the meeting minutes, articles and tidbits of information relevant to the Dakota Woodturners then getting it printed, mailed and emailed. The president's article, meeting minutes and other articles are emailed to me and I only have to copy and paste them into the draft version of newsletter. I will do some minor editing mainly to use space adequately. Once in awhile I receive a hand written article that I have to type directly into the draft version. I use Microsoft Publisher but any word processing application would work. I work with text boxes because they are easy to move and to size them. I also change the fonts in the articles to try and come up with a pleasing layout which is easy to read and isn't crowded. A copy is printed to be proof read and to see how it looks in printed form.

Once I think the newsletter is acceptable I convert the draft to a Acrobat pdf file which I email to Flash Printing. I also email a copy to members and other interested parties who I keep on an email distribution list. In addition to printing, Flash Printing folds and tapes the newsletter. I stop in to pick up the copies and then put on address labels and postage. With most people getting email copies we only mail about 45-50 copies per month.

I would be happy to answer any other questions and will work with the new Editor during the transition. I will always be available to answer questions.


Election for 2012 offices will be held at the December Meeting.
