

This new member has experience in working with


spindles and creating bottle stoppers. He enjoys working with most hard woods.


While waitressing, Andie saw John Warren's DWT shirt and asked him about it. Some months later she met DWT members





"that's the rest of the story". When he saw a tool that he needed for a project, he made it using his metal working skills. Of course, he would share it at the next meeting.



John moved to adjourn the meeting. Kleber seconded the motion. Motion carried.


