General Meeting Minutes - Sept 10, 2022

Meeting called to order at 9:02 a.m. Guests: Steve Hamell and Ed Penrey There were no minutes for August 2022 as there was no meeting.

Treasurer gave a report.

Old Business:

DWT Raffle – all 2700 tickets were sold. Discussion asked for written timeline and steps to take during the raffle process, which is already in progress of being completed. A request was made that the monies be counted by two people at each event and/or meeting. A request was made to post the names of the winners to our website. The estimated profit is about \$6,300. The group approach worked well to overseeing the raffle process.

Picnic – we made \$1,871 from the silent auction.

Summer Event summary – the lathes are still being repaired by Ron Day from the 4th of July storm. The tent was not salvageable. We still need to send a thank you to the Boy Scouts who helped clean up the mess from the storm. It was suggested that we only do minimal setup the night before to try to avoid damage as much as possible, then complete set-up in the morning.

New Business:

Ron Day was elected to the AAW Board (American Association of Wooodturners) Nick Agar event – Saturday, October 22nd will be a free demonstration day at the Career Academy. Sunday and Monday, the 23rd and 24th will be hands on days at Ron Day's at a cost of \$100. New turners are encouraged to sign up for these sessions. The project will be bowl turning and embellishments. Nick is a 30 year experienced turner. A link to his website was sent our previously.

Member Directory and new member intake – the members name, email address and phone number, along with a photo of the member (if available) would be sent to members who are current with their dues. Sheets with member

information and photos were sent around to be proofed by the members at the meeting. If a member chooses not to be included in the information sent to the members should "X" out their information and/or let Mark Kielpinski know you want to be excluded. The club is looking for someone to take new member info and a photo and get that data to the people in the club needing the information. Career Academy mentors - mentors are needed to help with the wood turnings classes. Times are Sept. 19-232 from 1:45 - 3:20, Oct. 3-7 from 11:45-1:25 and 1:55 -3:20 and Oct. 10-14 from 9:20 – 10:55 or 9:40 – 11:30 depending on day of the week. Sign-up sheets were passes around. Mentors are reminded that they need to sign a new security check form for this upcoming year before helping. Complete and give to Ron Day or John Warren. Freedom pens – 170 have been completed, 82 pens are currently checked out to be turned and 100 new kits have arrived. Contact Dolly Erickson to turn pens in or to check some out. Guard members will be returning and leaving in October.

Spring Symposium update – the symposium will be held April 21-23, 2023. Sally Ault and Mark Kielpinski are confirmed instructors. A third person is still being sought. Registration will start in December.

Discussion was held on the amount of interest from other clubs on our symposium and fund raising raffle.

Ron Day discussed a hybrid zoom meeting for those who might want to watch the meetings remotely if unable to attend in person. He is trying to determine if there is an interest by the members.

There was discussion held to determine if there is an interest in holding a second, more casual gathering to share turning information and tips, with no business being conducted.

Cancer Center Foundation is looking for donations for their raffle.

Some members have items for sale inside and out in vehicles. Anchor Seal is available to buy – ½ gallon for \$7.50 by Steve Hamar. President's Challenge – was won by Larry Nelson who chose the "Take" option and received a golf ball on a tee inside a jar. Mystery Prize was won by Doug Alm. WIT – next meeting is this coming Thursday at 6:00 and will cover tool sharpening. New members of either gender is welcome to this meeting.
