Eric's earliest memories of creating with wood are in Grandpa's dirt floor, basement workshop; he had a special place at the bench, right next to the scrap bin. Eric grew up around woodworking, but had never learned about a tool called the lathe until the first weekend in October of 2001, while attending a free demo at a woodworking store in Sumner, WA. It was here that his woodworking trajectory changed and the woodturning adventures began. Creating shavings on a lathe consumed Eric's thoughts for the next few weeks as he wrapped his brain around how a finished piece could emerge from rough materials so quickly! Years later, Eric's woodturning enthusiasm continues to grow.



Sally was born and raised in San Diego, California and graduated with a BA degree in Art with a Crafts emphasis from San Diego State. Her work there was focused on Weaving, Jewelry Design and Ceramics. During a furniture class, she discovered woodturning. She has won several prizes over the past few years.
