It was suggested at our last meeting that there be some sort of incentive to get people to bring in DWT Raffle items sooner. Well, here are the guidelines. It is somewhat of an extension from last year's raffle. These guidelines will be applicable from our meeting in November of 2023 until the March meeting of 2024. If you turn in a DWT Raffle pledge, you are assigned a number in the drawing which will occur at the DWT meetings from November 2023 until (and including) March 2024. If you pledge to make two items, two numbers are assigned to you. One number for each item pledged. When that item is completed and turned in for collection, you will be assigned another number. Once again, one additional number for each item turned in. Once your item is pledged or turned in it is eligible for the drawing until it wins, or until we have the last drawing at the March meeting. Your pledge sheet must be turned in to Mark Kielinski so it can be recorded. Drawings will be done at each monthly meeting during the drawing timeframe. A Random Number Generator app will be used to select the winner each month. Once your number has been drawn (selected) for either a pledge or a turned in item, it will not

be eligible for the remainder of the drawing. If an item wins for being pledged, it can still win if it is turned in during the drawing timeframe. So, what do the drawing winners get? The \$40 certificates could cover the cost of sanding disks or could be applied to a new light or some turning tools. It's up to you what you want to do with your certificates. 
There was no show and share for the October meeting as we used the time to get ready for the Helen Baily Demo after the shortened club meeting.
