Steve Wolff gave the treasurers report and noted that the AAW insurance premium had been paid for 2025.

Mike Oragaard showed a nice pair of segmented salt and pepper mills. Jeremy Guinn showed us two bowls and a Teddy bear produced from turned pieces. Larry Nelson showed two maple vases, one using burl. Somehow, I lost his picture. Dave Malarky showed a few turned spatulas. Mark Kielpinski showed a vase with burned zentangle emphasizing forms Becca had demoed for the club in October.

Jerry Dupong brought in and showed a large elm platter. Peggy Ruddick showed a vase and two segmented bowls. Jim Ruddick showed a natural edge bowl and a lidded box with a leather inlay. Steve Wolff brough in a wavy bowl made from three types of wood and cut into 4 layers. Jim Papacek brought in an ornament. Missing (I lost) photos of Jim and Larry, not sure how that happened.
