Meeting called to order at 9:02

Introduction of Guests – Rob Macana joined us. He has some experience in woodturning. Treasurer's Report – All outstanding bills are up to date. Gave details on the symposium expenses which was a slight financial loss to the club. Dolly Erickson made a motion to accept the April minutes as posted in the May newsletter. Seconded by Stan Zalumumskis. Motion carried.

Old Business

Report was given on the Mandan Band Blast. The steaks were reported to be huge. Additionally, there was a good turnout for their fundraiser. Additional discussion was had on the August Career and Technical Teachers' convention.

New Business

2700 tickets are available for the summer raffle. Mike Orgaard has the tickets today. They are two for \$5. Dave Malarkey reported that there are 12 raffle items that still need to be collected. Mark K gave the contact details for Art in the Park. The event is in the middle of the week this year. A volunteer count was made to ensure coverage. Capital Affaire will be Aug 3rd and 4th . Discussion was held on the spring symposium. Jim learned a lot and George liked seeing new styles and techniques. Mark K made a motion to host a

spring symposium in 2025 and Denise seconded. Motion carried. Possible names for fall and spring events were discussed.

Wood Supply update – Ron has hosted a couple sessions of wood processing for the club. Let him know if you want to be involved in future chop-athons. Additionally keep an eye out for more wood sources. A discussion was held on future demos that club members want to see or host. There was a desire for more hollow form techniques and the various captured systems, both commercial and homemade. A request was made for more detailed finishing processes. John Warren offered to host a recap of the AAW national symposium. Additionally, there is interest in demonstrations about rose engine lathes. Lastly time saving techniques and methods for repeating objects was requested, that could likely be an ornament and finial demonstration.

Other

Larry Nelson reported that Bismarck Downtown Artist Collective, or BDAC, showed an interest in the possibility of a month-long display of wood art. There was interest by club members. Larry will continue discussions.

Mark K announced there were additional blanks from the symposium available for sale. Dolly was the winner of the mystery prize. A sweet ice cream scoop kit. She didn't mention if we were invited to her house for a Sunday though. I assume we all are. John Warren thanked Denise for her work on getting the raffle tickets squared away.
